English

- Remember a **title** and date on each piece of new work in your copy. A title needs a capital letter!
- **Capital letters** are needed for people, places, pets, days, months, titles and of course the start of a new sentence. Always remember to use a capital I when speaking about yourself. You are important!
- **Skip a line** between each question to keep your work neat and tidy. Write the number of the question into your margin.
- Try and write at least **one page** of news. This copy will be like your diary of your time off. You might look back on it in years to come!
- **Neat** handwriting. Slow and steady wins the race!
- When you draw a diagram, like a life cycle please **label** it.
